A groundbreaking mobile museum that showcases a proud legacy of African-American courage, HOW hosts re-enactments, exhibits, and presentations wherever and whenever duty calls. The museum is the brainchild of Luther Johnson, a renowned authority and frequent speaker on the subject.

Johnson and his museum will make a stop on July 31 at the Italian American Veterans Museum in Stone Park, where their exhibit and presentation will shed light on a compelling dimension of our military history.

Both museums will be open from 1-5 p.m., and Johnson will give his presentation at 3 p.m. Light refreshments will be served throughout the day.
