Attacks on Veterans / Cuts to VA

- Impacts of outreach cuts are serious—they may not impact benefits directly, but they impact how people can access resources and become aware of their benefits.
- These cuts are clearly meant to lead to privatization of the VA—from healthcare to housing.
- Veterans on the ground are confused and concerned, some areas more than others.
 People believe in the quality of VA healthcare and don't want it taken away, especially for service-disabled veterans.
- Veterans who used to work for the VA or currently do are uniquely triggered—veterans are having to lay off other veterans.
- Folks want to see more dedicated attention on how Elon Musk is targeting the VA—this
 seems to be getting less attention than USAID/Social Security/Medicaid, etc. It is deeply
 concerning that Musk has access to veterans' personal and sensitive data, including
 health data.
- Hines and Jesse Brown have been understaffed historically—so these cuts are going to
 only worsen and compound. We need MORE Veteran Service Officers in the district and
 state, not less.
- These attacks on veterans are going to impact both the recruitment and retention of servicemembers. It'll take time for us to see the impacts, but speaks to danger.
